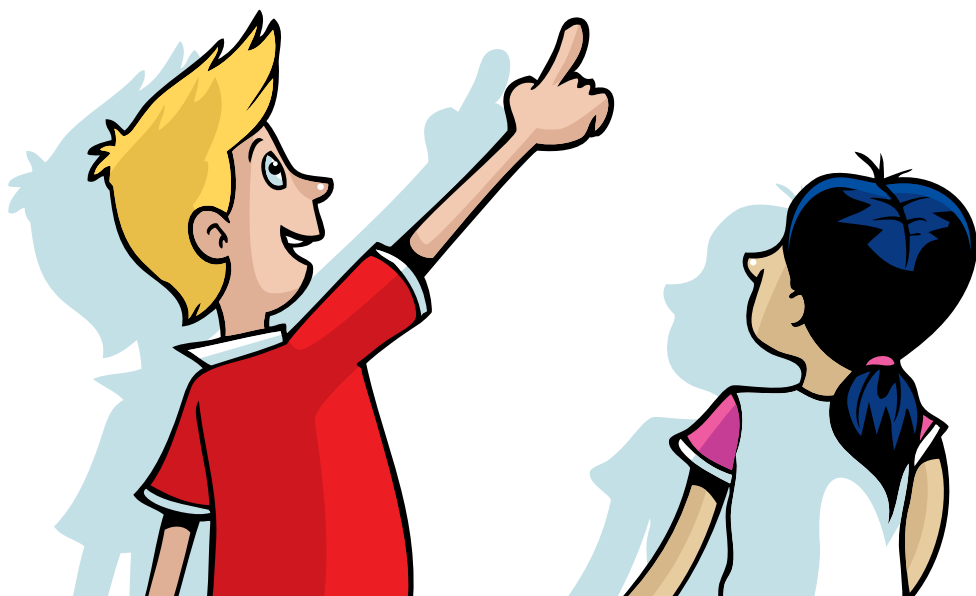

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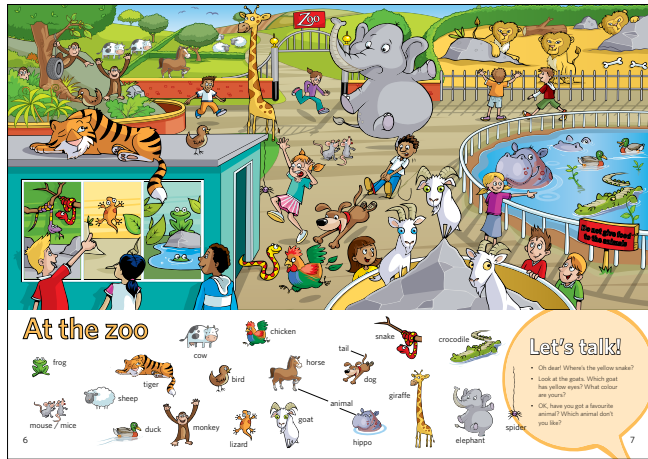


# About this book

There are lots of words to find in the pictures. Can the children find them all?

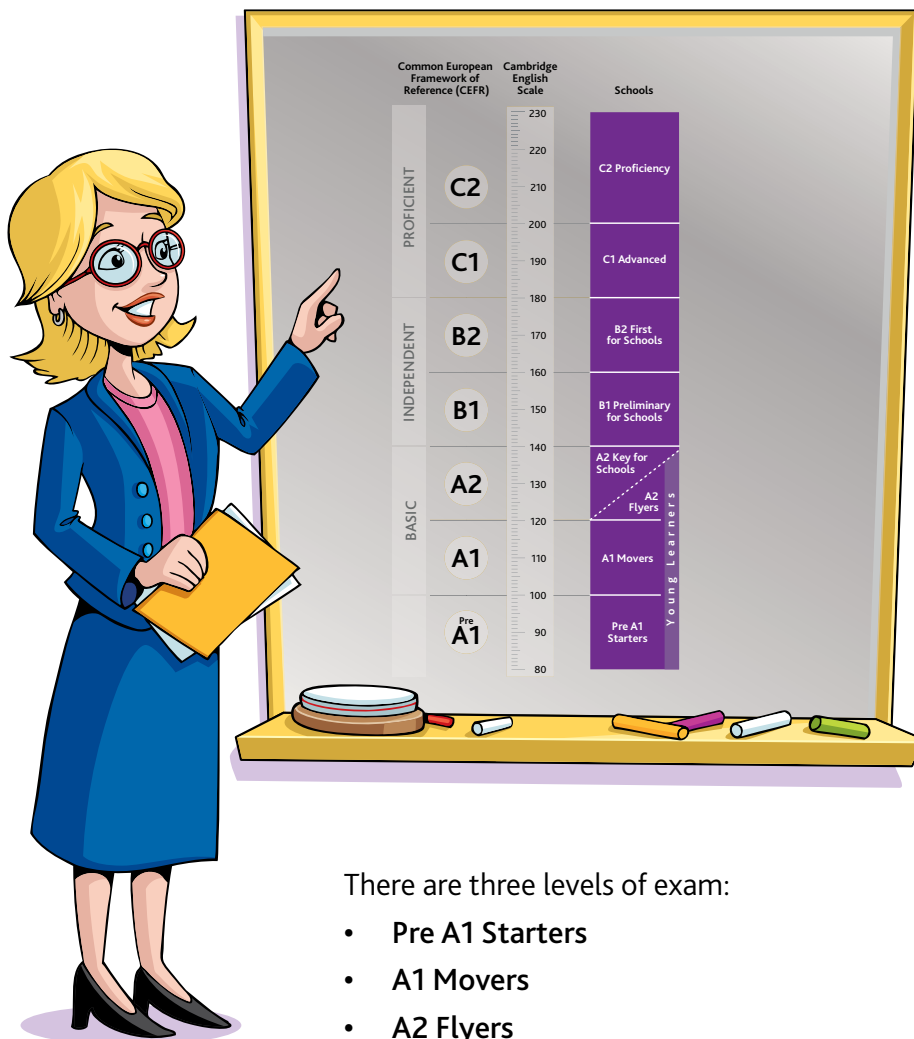
